My dearest John, Thank you for such great report and giving me the honor to hear what God is doing in your life. I rejoice with you that you are back into PastorCare. God has shaped you through fire in order to help pastors. Few people I know does it so well than you, because you have been there, and you have a shepherd heart. So praise God for the good news. I have some sad news to give. But I am not down, depressed or resentful. The church kicked me out after 8 years, saying I can't be a pastor because I am divorced!!! Of course they knew all along I was divorced. All church documents I am listed as pastor. But because our leaders asked for a salary for me, they said they don't have the money and I can't be a pastor!!!! My initial thought was to abandon ministry and take care of my retirement. But about 25 people left and requested my support. We have met in a hotel in the last two weeks, and are looking for a host church. The demonstration of love and the prayers from God's people have been such that I am not depressed, angry or resentful. I have my moments of sadness, but I have found comfort seeing the love of those around me. Oh! The church of Christ!!!! What a mess? How much politics? So much envy. So much backstabbing. I guess it is part of the price we pay to complete what Christ has to suffer for his church. Please pray for my healing and for a new location for worship service. John, Always good to hear from you friend and see that, no matter what, your love for the church always keeps you busy with the Kingdom. I feel the same way. I started going to counseling with a pastor/counselor which has been helpful. I am meeting with a small group of 30 believers for fellowship and teaching the Scripture. Most of the time I am doing well, but there are moments of great distress, or moments of desperation. But God has enabled me to overcome those moments and I keep going.
